The combined sewer relocation project has been approved by New York City Department of Environmental Protection and the approval of the new 12th Avenue storm sewer is pending. We are committed to maintaining a work site that is safe and orderly. Dust, noise and heavy equipment are intrusive but common elements of construction. We are working to minimize the inconvenience and appreciate your patience.

Work to be Performed

- Installation and Relocation of Combined Sanitary/Storm Sewers
- New Dedicated Storm Sewer
- New 48" Water Main
- New 12" Water Main Distribution Lines
- New Fire Hydrants
- New 24" Gas Main
- New 6" Gas Mains Distribution Lines
- New Con Edison Vaults, Manholes and Distribution Conduits
- New Curb and Sidewalk Replacements
- New Roadway Reconstruction

Location

- This project will take place at the following locations:
- Broadway between W. 131st Street and W. 125th Street
- W. 129th Street between W. 125th Street and Broadway
- W. 125th Street between Marginal and 129th Streets
- 12th Avenue between St. Clair Place and 131st Street
- Marginal Street between 125th Street and St. Clair Place

Please take note of the following:

- Pedestrian Street Access will be maintained at all times.
- Vehicular Access may need to be temporarily restricted, generally during work hours.
- Signs will be posted informing residents of necessary street closures and/or limited access
- Parking may be temporarily restricted where necessary to allow construction to proceed. Signs will be posted indicating the temporary restrictions.
- Driveway access may be temporarily restricted in order to perform certain work.
- Public transportation. Some bust stops and/or bus routes may be moved or changed during the course of the construction. Signs and directions will be posted showing the new stops and/or routes.

Property Damage

Property damage and liability insurance coverage shall be maintained until the work is complete. In the event that there is property damage as a result of the work, you are required to advise Columbia University in writing.

Some Water Interruptions

During the course of the project, you may experience water service disruptions, Water may be discolored by sediment that has built up in the older pipes, including the service connection to the internal pipes in your own building. Even if no construction is performed in front of your building, the process of shutting down the old pipes can result in discoloration. If this occurs, run only cold water until it appears clear. If it will be necessary for us to turn off your water service, you will , with exception to emergencies, receive written notice from NYC DEP informing you by the afternoon of the day before service interruption. Water service is always restored at the end of the workday. Be sure to turn off any open valves or faucets to prevent flooding when water is restored.

Note

If your water service is NOT restored by 6 pm, unless the shutoff notice gives special instructions regarding non-standard hours, please contact NYC DEP 311 Service Center available 24 hours a day.
