DO I HAVE THE FLU, COVID, OR A COLD?

COVID-19, caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, is a respiratory virus that is similar in many ways to influenza (the flu) and the common cold. With the flu and colds being more common in the fall and winter, it is important to be aware of which illnesses cause which symptoms. Promptly recognizing and identifying the symptoms of COVID-19, the flu, common cold and allergies can help ensure proper treatment.

Influenza and COVID-19 can both cause coughing, fevers/chills, shortness of breath, fatigue, sore throat, headaches, muscle and body aches, and vomiting or diarrhea. However, sudden loss of smell or taste is not typical of influenza or the common cold. Both influenza and colds often cause runny noses and sniffles, which are not typical of COVID-19. Colds can also cause sore throat and coughing.

Flu symptoms typically appear 1-2 days after exposure, and COVID-19 symptoms typically appear within 5 days. If you are experiencing symptoms that could be influenza or COVID-19, public health authorities encourage you to follow isolation guidelines and seek testing to confirm your diagnosis.
