Obligation

Shuttle Bus Service for the Elderly and Disabled. Commencing on May 20, 2009, CU shall provide a shuttle bus service complying with ADA specifications to connect the Project Site to subway stations at 116th Street and Broadway, 125th Street and Broadway, 168th Street and Broadway and Harlem Hospital Center. The shuttle bus service shall be provided free of charge to members of the public who are disabled or who are senior citizens, including their attendants. The shuttle bus service shall run on a regular schedule throughout the day every weekday except State and Federal public holidays. If during this period the IRT subway station located at 96th Street and Broadway is made ADA accessible, CU shall provide shuttle bus service to connect this station to the locations above. The shuttle bus service shall be provided through 2033, but may be discontinued if and when the 125th Street IRT station becomes ADA accessible.

* The Obligation End Date is December 31, 2033, unless the shuttle bus service for the elderly and disabled is discontinued if and when the 125th Street IRT station becomes ADA accessible, per the obligation language above.

Process

- As of Fall of 2009 Columbia has modified its Shuttle Service to allow elderly and disabled to utilize the service, consistent with ADA specifications to connect the Project Site to subway stations at 116th Street and Broadway, 125th Street and Broadway, 168th Street and Broadway and Harlem Hospital Center.
- Since January 2, 2011, the Columbia shuttle route was extended to include the 96th Street station, just prior to the MTA station at 96th Street and Broadway being made ADA accessible.

Intercampus Shuttle Route Maps

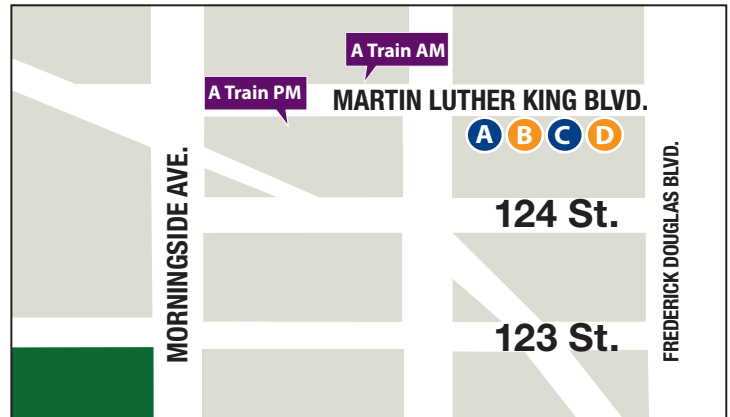



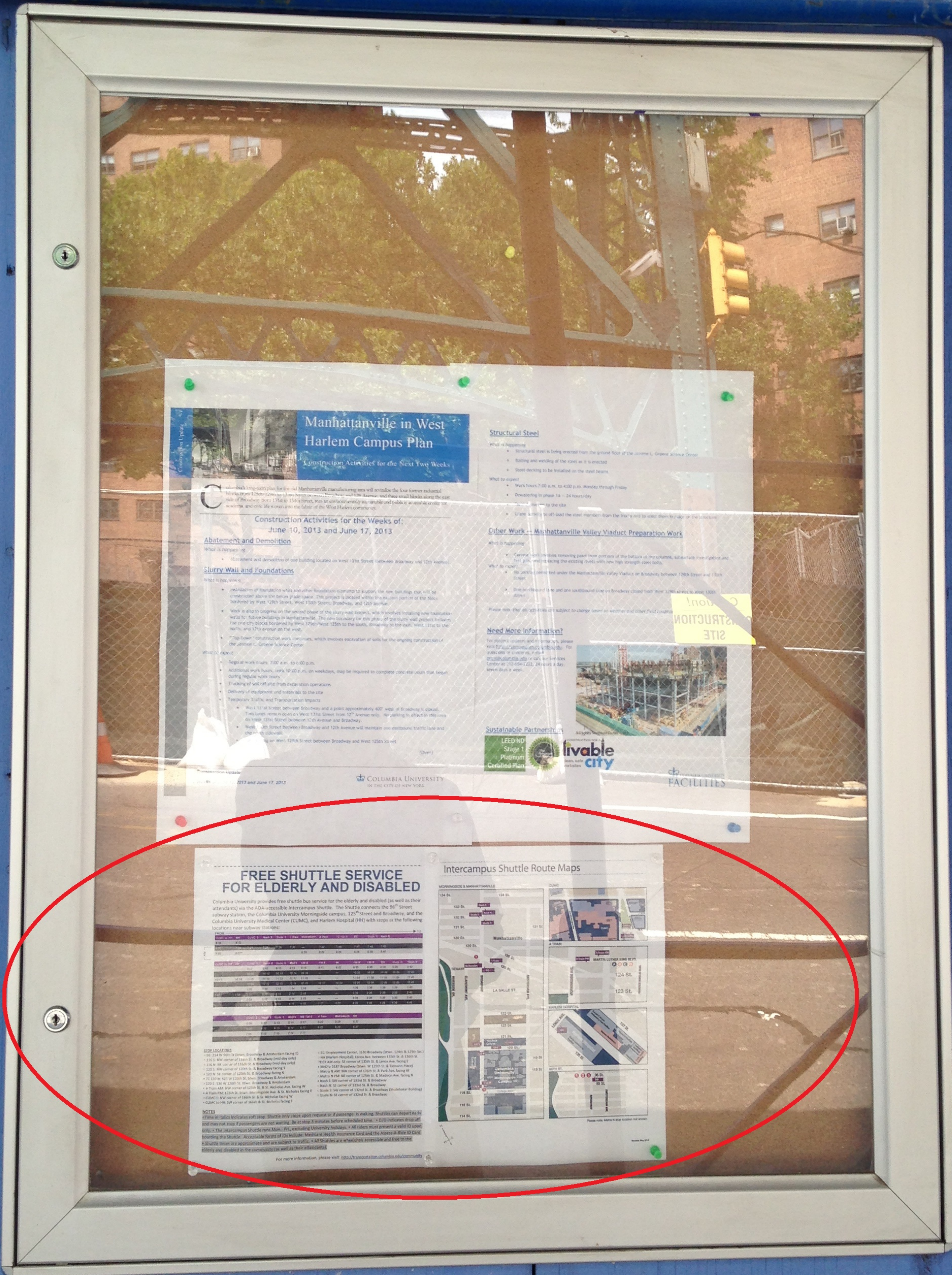

Construction Activities for the Next Two Weeks

Construction Activities for the Weeks of: June 10, 2013 and June 17, 2013

Abatement and Demolition

- Removal and abatement of one building located on West 129th Street between Broadway and 129th Avenue.

Slurry Wall and Foundations

- Installation of foundation walls and other foundation structures for the new building, which will be constructed above the below-grade space. This project is located within the city limits of the West Harlem at West 129th Street, West 129th Street, Broadway, and 129th Avenue.
- Work is also in progress on the second phase of the slurry wall project, which involves installing the foundation walls for future building in Manhattanville. The new boundary for this phase of the study was project include the area city blocks bordered by West 129th Street, 129th Avenue, Broadway, and the East River to the north, and 130th Avenue to the west.
- "Dig-down" construction work, which involves excavation of soils for the ongoing construction of the second L-Ginger School Center.

What is happening?

- Regular work hours: 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Additional work hours, work 10:00 a.m. on weekdays, may be required to complete critical tasks that begin during regular work hours.
- Trucking of soil fill and fresh material operations.
- Delivery of equipment and material to the site.
- Temporary traffic and transportation impacts.
- West 129th Street between Broadway and a point approximately 420' west of Broadway is closed. Two lanes will remain on West 129th Street from 127th Avenue only. No parking is allowed in blocks 48 (West 129th Street) between 126th Avenue and Broadway.
- West 130th Street between Broadway and 129th Avenue will maintain one eastbound traffic lane and one westbound traffic lane.

Structural Steel

What is happening?

- Structural steel is being erected from the ground floor of the Jerome L. Green School Center.
- Bolting and welding of the steel as it is erected.
- Steel decking to be installed on the steel beams.

What is expected?

- Work hours 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- Overseeing in place 14 - 24 hours daily.
- Crane and hoist to lift load the steel members from the ground and to erect them in place on the building.

Other Work -- Manhattanville Valley Viaduct Preparation Work

What is happening?

- General earth removal from portions of the bottom of the viaduct, below the foundation and what is known as the "fill" structure.
- Removal of concrete under the Manhattanville Valley Viaduct on Broadway between 129th Street and 128th Street.
- On the eastbound lane and one southbound lane on Broadway closed from West 129th Street to West 128th Street.

Summer at Columbia: Programs Bring Local Students to Campus

Recent participants in the Columbia University Local Community High School Summer Internship Program paid a visit to the Diabetes Center at Columbia University Medical Center/NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital.

Bringing young people to campus for summer internships and camps is part of a continuing effort to make the University's resources available to our neighbors. One such program provides scholarships for children in the Manhattanville/West Harlem area to attend Roaree's Cubs Camps, a sports program for children 6 through 12. Another program offers paid, five-week summer internships for high school students.

Columbia's Summer Program for High School Students at the School of Continuing

Education, now in its 27th year, offers an opportunity for high-achieving students to get a taste of college life. The students take part in organized sports and community outreach projects and attend college prep classes. Scholarships are available to students nominated by local community organizations.

Design for Excellence: New Sports Center Reflects Commitment to Athletics and Community

The New York Times has called Columbia's new Campbell Sports Center a building that shows both its "brains and its brawn," which makes perfect sense for a facility meant to support the University's athletic and academic excellence.

The sports center isn't the only change coming to the athletics complex, which faces the waterfront in Inwood Hill Park. The University is building the Boathouse Marsh, which will restore the park's salt marsh and create public access to previously inaccessible waterfront along the Harlem River.

Made possible through the generosity of numerous donors, the facility is named in honor of Columbia's trustee chair, William V. Campbell, who was the captain of Columbia's football team in 1961.

Campbell, recalling his years as a Columbia linebacker, and later the team's coach, described the dilapidated Baker Field, when he coached there in the 1970s, as "not a welcoming place." Today, by contrast, "we have a stadium, now we have a welcoming gate, now we have an athletics facility that the students, the faculty, the alumni and the neighborhood will all be glad to be a part of."

Annual Meetings With Columbia University Faculty and Administrators

Columbia University's Office of Government and Community Affairs, or other appropriate office, each spring provides opportunities for interested members of Columbia University's academic community to meet with members of the West Harlem Development Corporation (WHDC) to discuss ways in which research might help support the activities and priorities of the WHDC.

Athletics Clinics

Columbia University's varsity sports programs and coaches of football, volleyball, basketball, soccer, swimming, track and field, and tennis sponsor and participate in seasonal sports clinics for local community children between the ages of 5 and 13 in University facilities and throughout Harlem and Washington Heights.

Columbia Employment Information Center

The Columbia Employment Information Center (CEIC) (the "Center") serves as the central community-based resource for local residents to apply for open positions at Columbia University.

The Center provides a wide range of services to the local community including in-person and online job readiness training programs, one-on-one job-search counseling and assistance, and access to online job opportunities at Columbia.

Columbia University Minority-, Women-, and Locally-Owned (MWL) Construction Trades Certificate Mentorship Program

The Columbia University Minority-, Women-, and Locally-owned (MWL) Construction Trades Certificate Mentorship Program ("the Program") is a two-year mentorship program offered by Columbia University (CU) in partnership with the City of New York Small Business Services (SBS). The Program provides construction administration training, one-on-one technical assistance and networking opportunities to help build the capacity of small- and medium-sized MWL construction trade firms to respond to bidding opportunities and manage the construction job cycle.

Dental Health Screenings for Senior Citizens

Columbia University offers free dental health screenings for senior citizens throughout Northern Manhattan via the ElderSmile Program. As part of Columbia University's College of Dental Medicine Community DentCare Network, the ElderSmile Program offers free dental screenings and referrals for further dental treatment at senior centers throughout Washington Heights/Inwood and Harlem, including New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) residents in Manhattanville Houses and General Grant Houses.

Housing Legal Assistance

For the period from January 1, 2009, through December 31, 2014, Columbia University will provide funding for one attorney, acceptable to New York City's Housing Preservation & Development Office (NYCHPO).

For the period from January 1, 2015, through December 31, 2030, Columbia University will provide funding for two attorneys at a legal assistance provider acceptable to NYCHPO serving the Manhattanville Area, to provide anti-eviction/anti-harassment legal assistance for residents of the Manhattanville area. Funding will not exceed \$4 million through December 31, 2030.

Mobile Dental Center for Preschool Children

Columbia University offers free dental care for preschool-age children from the Manhattanville in West Harlem area through the Mobile Dental Center. The Mobile Dental Center is a program of Columbia University's College of Dental Medicine Community DentCare Network, which aims to reduce dental decay and improve the oral health of Northern Manhattan's underserved children, through comprehensive dental treatment and oral health education.

The Columbia University Local Community High School Summer Internship Program

Columbia University offers paid summer internships for high school students from the local community and upper level students at the Columbia Secondary School (CSS) for Math, Science, and Engineering. The Columbia University Local Community High School Summer Internship Program is a structured five-week program designed to provide students with practical work experience before graduation. The program began with students from the local community in 2010 and added students from CSS in 2012 when students reached the upper grades and became age-eligible for such an internship. The internships take place in existing Columbia facilities and will be moved to the new Academic and Academic Research buildings proposed within the Project Site when constructed.

Shuttle Bus Service for the Elderly and Disabled

Columbia University provides a shuttle bus service free of charge to members of the local community who are disabled or who are senior citizens (including their attendants) via the ADA-accessible Inter-campus Shuttle. The shuttle bus service complies with ADA specifications to connect the Project Site to subway stations at:

- 96th Street and Broadway
- 116th Street and Broadway (Morningside Campus)
- 125th Street and Broadway
- Harlem Hospital Center (135th Street and Lenox Avenue)
- Columbia University Medical Center (168th Street and Broadway)

The shuttle bus service runs on a regular schedule throughout the day on every weekday, except on state and federal public holidays.

Space Provisions for Non-Columbia-Affiliated Local Artists and Cultural Organizations

Columbia University, consistent with current practice, makes good faith efforts to accommodate requests by local artists and cultural organizations not affiliated with Columbia for access to its indoor or outdoor spaces for programming that may include, but is not limited to, information sessions, performances, special events or presentations. Payment for such space will be in accordance with then current University protocols. Columbia University space is generally awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, with priority given to Columbia and student activities, followed by local community activities.

Summer Camp Scholarships

Columbia University offers 25 scholarships per summer, based upon financial need, for children from the Manhattanville in West Harlem area to attend Columbia's Summer Sports Camp: Roar-ee's Cubs Summer Camp. One scholarship is equal to one week of summer camp.

Undergraduate Scholarships for Aid-Eligible Students From the Local Community

In an effort to encourage local students to attend Columbia College and the Fu Foundation School of Engineering and Applied Science, Columbia University undertakes a targeted recruitment effort for qualified students from the local community. Columbia University has established a scholarship fund to serve up to 40 aid-eligible undergraduate students per year who are admitted to Columbia College and/or the Fu Foundation School of Engineering and Applied Science, with funding made available to meet their fully demonstrated financial need.

ADULTS AND SENIORS

TRANSPORTATION

In 2009, Columbia University began providing free shuttle service to seniors, those with disabilities, and their attendants. Since then, Columbia has provided the free shuttle service for travel to and from subway stations at 96th Street and Broadway, 116th and Broadway, 125th Street and Broadway, Columbia University Medical Center at 168th Street, and Harlem Hospital Center. Flyers with information about the shuttle have been distributed to Community Board 9, Manhattanville and Grant Houses, and the offices of local elected officials. The shuttle bus service runs on a regular schedule throughout the day every weekday, except on state and federal holidays, and is meant to complement, not replace, existing MTA service. The shuttle bus schedule can be found at <http://transportation.columbia.edu>.

ELDERSMILE

For more than four years, ElderSmile at Columbia's College of Dental Medicine has been providing much-needed dental screening to older persons living in Upper Manhattan communities. Experienced dental school faculty, assisted by students, staff the ElderSmile program. Those who need more in-depth dental care are referred to ElderSmile treatment centers. Dental care professionals visit senior centers to provide patient education and screening. ElderSmile provides important care to those more vulnerable to serious dental conditions and related diseases such as diabetes, heart and lung diseases, and stroke.

COMMUNITY SCHOLARS

As part of its commitment to the community in connection with the Manhattanville campus expansion, Columbia established a Community Scholars Program to offer adults from northern Manhattan access to Columbia University services and resources. The Community Scholars Program supports and facilitates the work of individuals toward the completion of a particular project or toward attaining skills in a specific area of interest. In 2013, the inaugural cohort of scholars will be made up of five local residents—each with a three-year appointment—enabling them to pursue their lifelong learning aspirations. MANHATTANVILLE CONTINUING EDUCATION AUDITING PROGRAM

Beginning in September 2013, 50 members of the local community became eligible for free auditing of courses, with 25 of those members coming from Manhattanville and/or Grant Houses. The Auditing Program provides adults not currently enrolled in college with the opportunity, free of charge, to audit selected classes and lectures drawn from the University's offerings in the Arts and Sciences during the academic year. Auditors are encouraged to attend classes and to keep up with the reading. No examinations or papers are required, and no grade is assigned. Auditors will also have access to Columbia Libraries and services at campus cafés and the University Bookstore, and they may take advantage of cultural discount programs in New York City offered to other Columbia students.

MANHATTANVILLE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR LIFELONG LEARNERS

Also in September 2013, Columbia University expanded its Lifelong Learners Program to include up to 50 members of the local community, with 25 of those members coming from Manhattanville and/or Grant Houses. The Lifelong Learners Program provides an opportunity for individuals over 65 and not currently enrolled in college to audit select lectures and courses drawn from the University's offerings in the Arts and Sciences during the academic year, at no charge. First launched in 1986 in partnership with the Brookdale Institute on Aging and Human Development, Columbia's School for Continuing Education runs the Lifelong Learners Program.

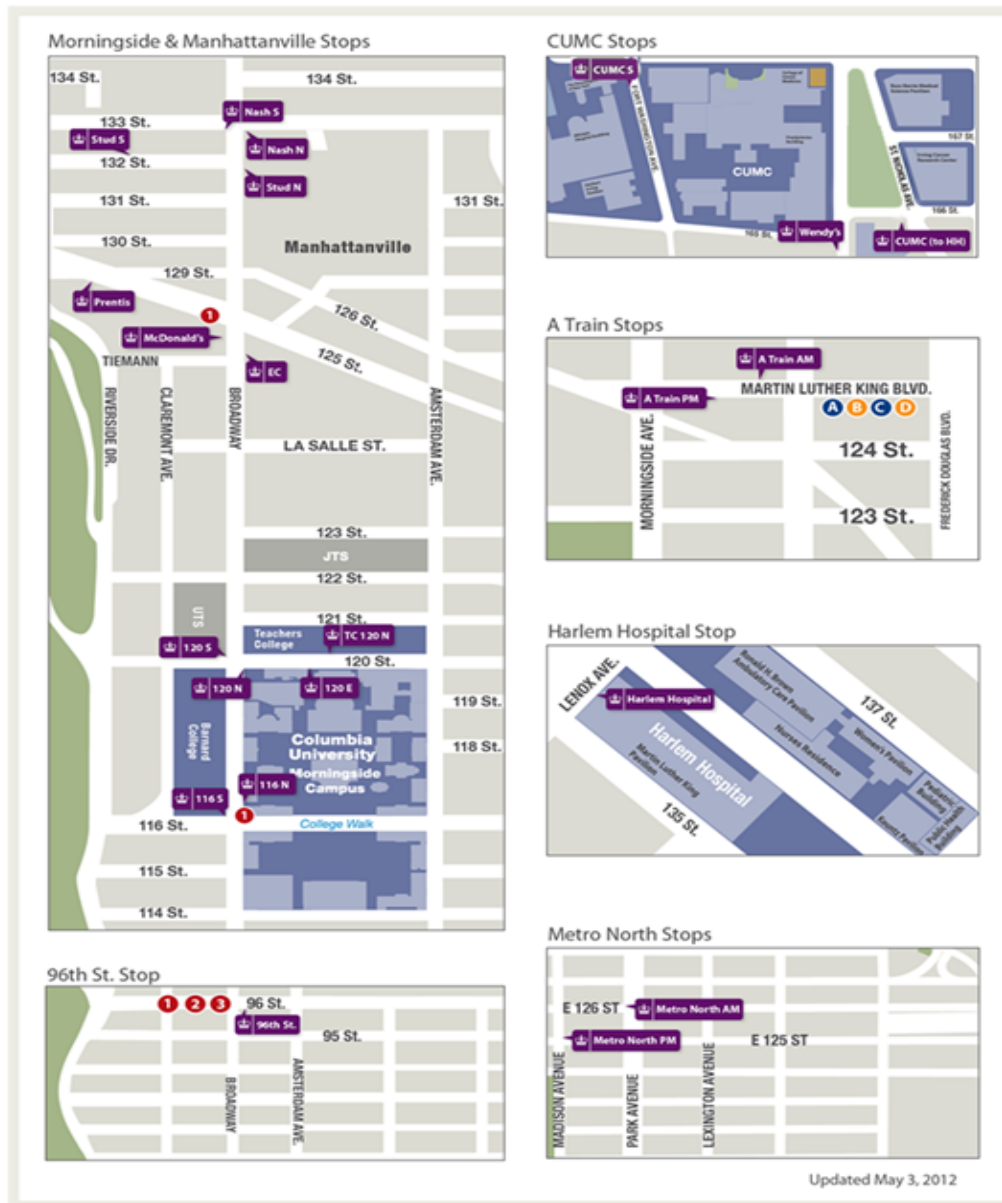
