Through a special partnership between Columbia University, The City University of New York ("CUNY") and the northern Manhattan community, the CUNY/Columbia University Health Sciences Internship Awards Program, renamed the Stanley E. Michels Health Careers Scholarship Program in 2013, (the "Program") was created to increase the number of local residents entering the medical field and to provide job opportunities and training at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center.




