Through a special partnership between Columbia University, The City University of New York ("CUNY") and the northern Manhattan community, the CUNY/Columbia University Health Sciences Internship Awards Program, renamed the Stanley E. Michels Health Careers Scholarship Program in 2013, (the "Program") was created to increase the number of local residents entering the medical field and to provide job opportunities and training at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center.

As stated in the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions dated December 14, 2011, Columbia University ("Columbia") has agreed to commit \$1 million to expand the Stanley E. Michels Health Careers Scholarship Program in an effort to increase the number of residents from Community Districts 9 and 12 pursuing careers in health sciences.

In accordance with Columbia's commitment, in 2011 Columbia agreed to make ten (10) annual payments of \$100,000, per the Payment and Reporting Schedule (see Exhibit A), to the Medgar Evers College Research and Development Corporation (the "College") for the Program. Annual payments began in 2011 and will continue through 2020, provided that the program continues to operate in substantially the same manner as it currently does. I am pleased to learn that with Columbia University funds, you were able to support 10 students from Districts 9 and 12 in the 2012-2013 academic year.

In June of each year, CUNY shall submit a report, per the Payment and Reporting Schedule (see Exhibit A), identifying how many students received the funds each year, the amount of funding each student received, the program in which they have enrolled, the zip code of their home address, and the community district in which they reside, to affirm their local resident status. The report should also include the total amount spent against the total amount received from Columbia at that time.

Through a special partnership between Columbia University, The City University of New York and the northern Manhattan community, the CUNY/Columbia University Health Sciences Internship Awards Program (the "Program") was created to increase the number of local residents entering the medical field and provide job opportunities and training at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center.

As stated in the General Project Plan dated December 18, 2008, Columbia University ("Columbia") has agreed to commit \$1 million to expand the CUNY-Columbia Health Sciences Award Program to increase the number of residents from Community Districts 9 and 12 pursuing careers in health sciences.

In accordance with Columbia's commitment, Columbia hereby agrees to make ten (10) annual payments of \$100,000 to the Medgar Evers College Research and Development Corporation (the "College") for the Program. Disbursements shall be made by Columbia on July 30 of each year, to be available for students in the fall semester. The first payment shall be made by Columbia on July 30, 2011 and continue for ten (10) years through 2020, provided that the program continues to operate in substantially the same manner as it currently does.

On June 30 of each year the College shall submit a report to Columbia identifying how many students received the funds each year, the amount of funding they received, the program in which they have enrolled, and the zip code of their home address to affirm their local resident status.
