Obligation

Shuttle Bus Service for the Elderly and Disabled. Commencing on May 20, 2009, CU shall provide a shuttle bus service complying with ADA specifications to connect the Project Site to subway stations at 116th Street and Broadway, 125th Street and Broadway, 168th Street and Broadway and Harlem Hospital Center. The shuttle bus service shall be provided free of charge to members of the public who are disabled or who are senior citizens, including their attendants. The shuttle bus service shall run on a regular schedule throughout the day every weekday except State and Federal public holidays. If during this period the IRT subway station located at 96th Street and Broadway is made ADA accessible, CU shall provide shuttle bus service to connect this station to the locations above. The shuttle bus service shall be provided through 2033, but may be discontinued if and when the 125th Street IRT station becomes ADA accessible.

*The Obligation End Date is December 31, 2033, unless the shuttle bus service for the elderly and disabled is discontinued if and when the 125th Street IRT station becomes ADA accessible, per the obligation language above.

WHEREAS, the Agreement grants to Academy the right to provide non-exclusive shuttle services to the Columbia community;

WHEREAS, Licensor and Academy desire to amend the Agreement as hereinafter set forth.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

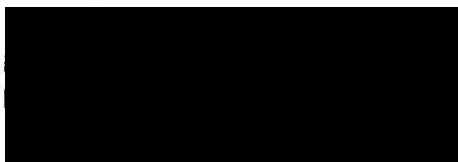

2. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

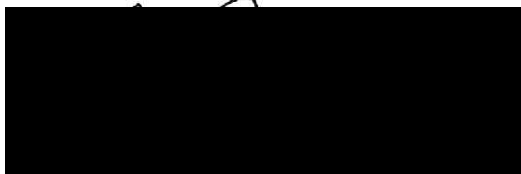

Scholarships for Lifelong Learners

Columbia University provides scholarships for 50 residents of Manhattanville Houses, Grant Houses, and the local community who are 65 years of age and older to audit up to two courses per year. Administered through Columbia's School of Professional Studies, the Lifelong Learners Program is designed for individuals committed to the principles of lifelong education.

Space Provisions for Non-Columbia-Affiliated Local Artists and Cultural Organizations

Columbia University, consistent with current practice, makes good faith efforts to accommodate requests by local artists and cultural organizations not affiliated with Columbia for access to its indoor or outdoor spaces for programming that may include, but is not limited to, information sessions, performances, special events or presentations. Payment for such space will be in accordance with then current University protocols. 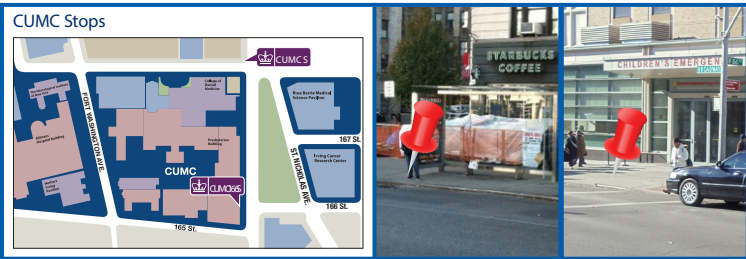

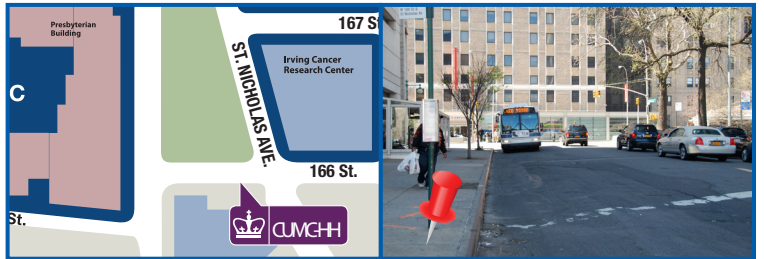

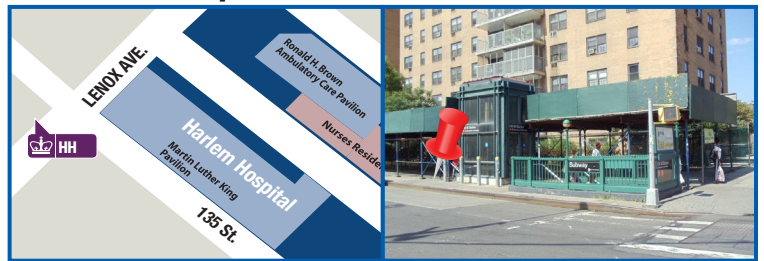

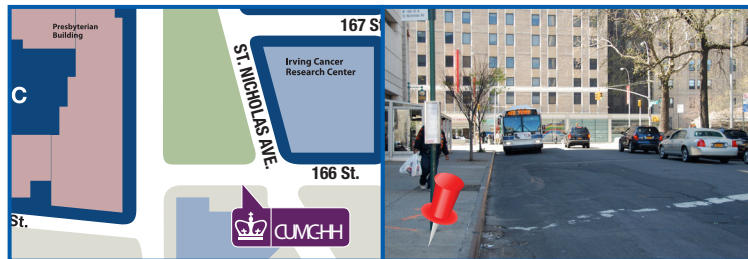

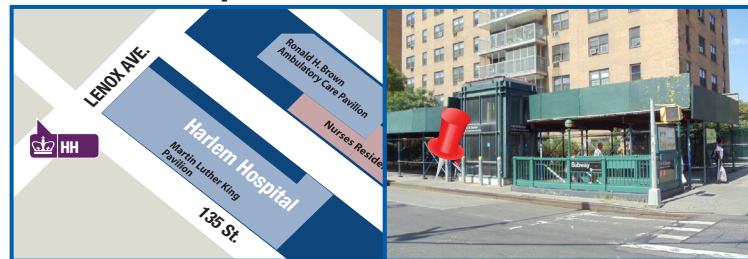

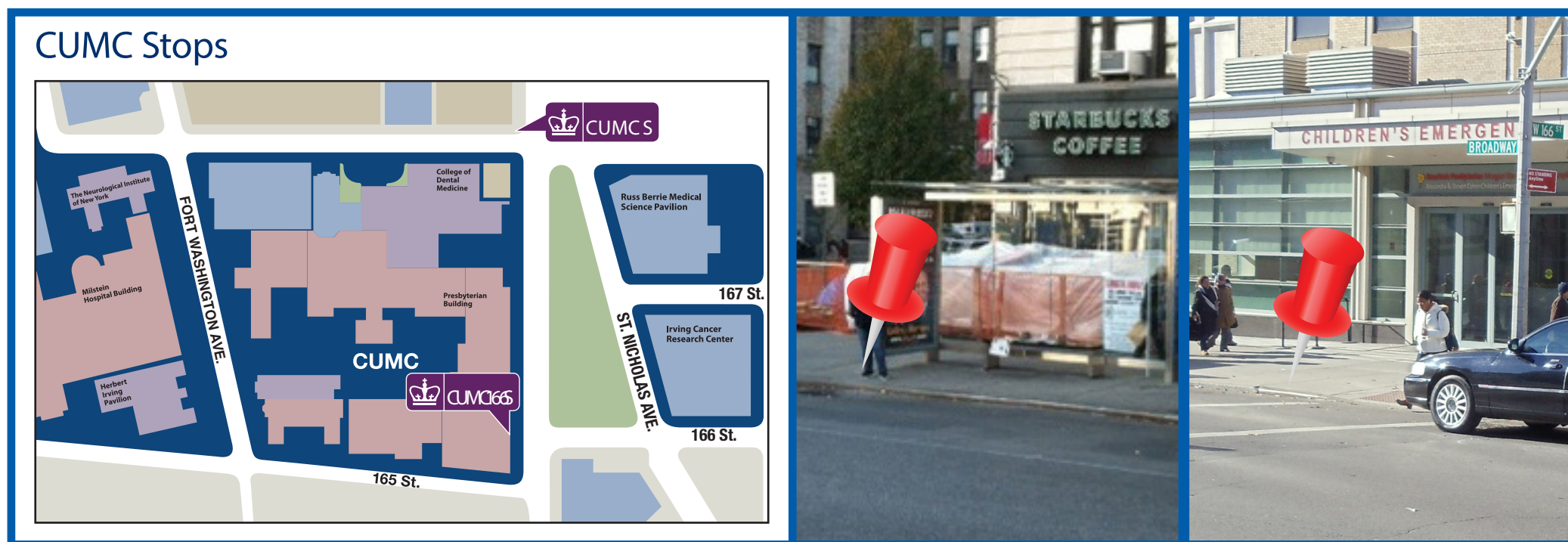

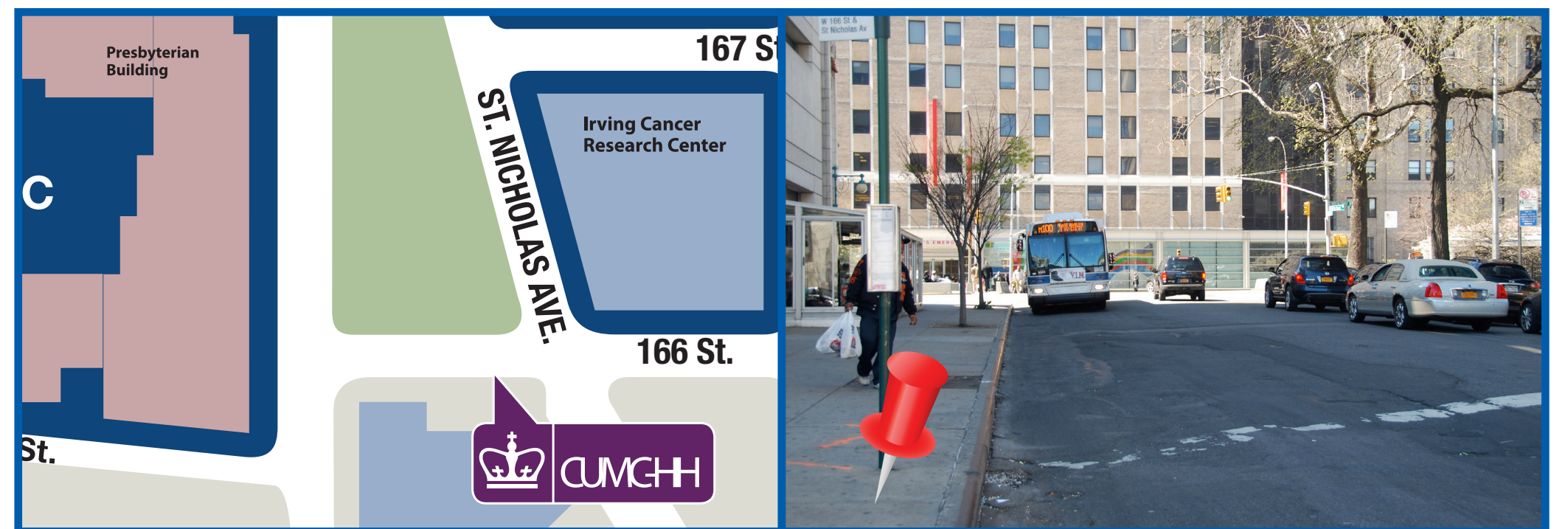

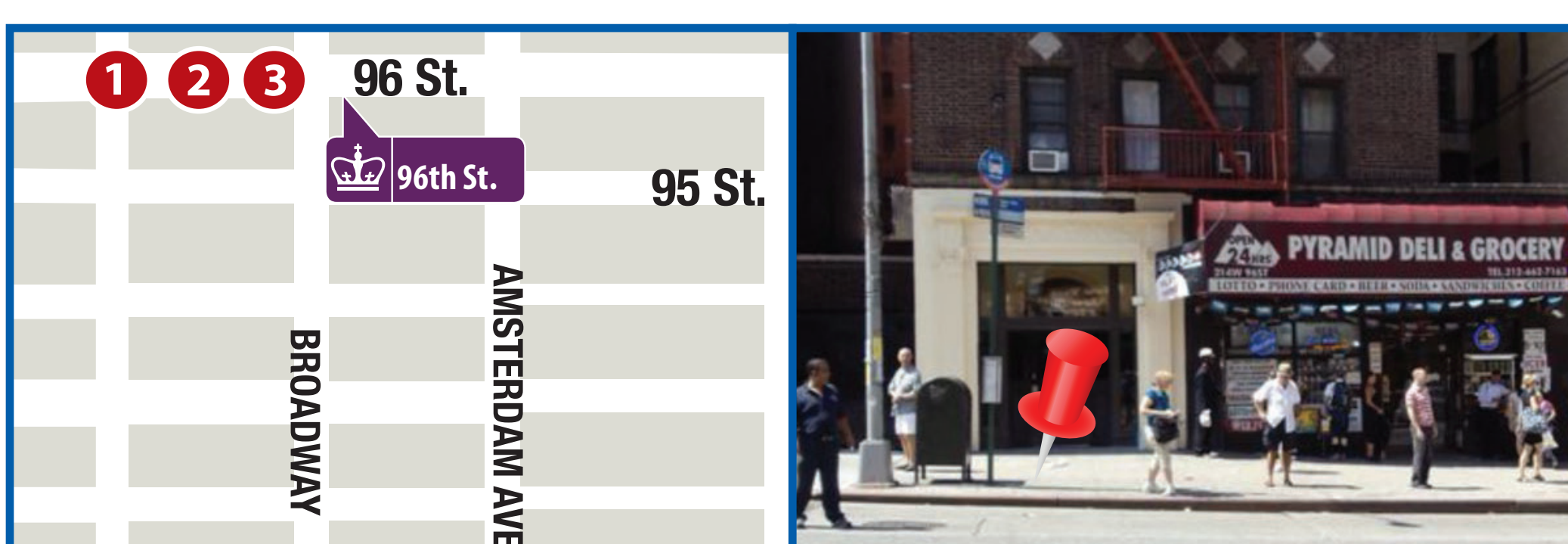

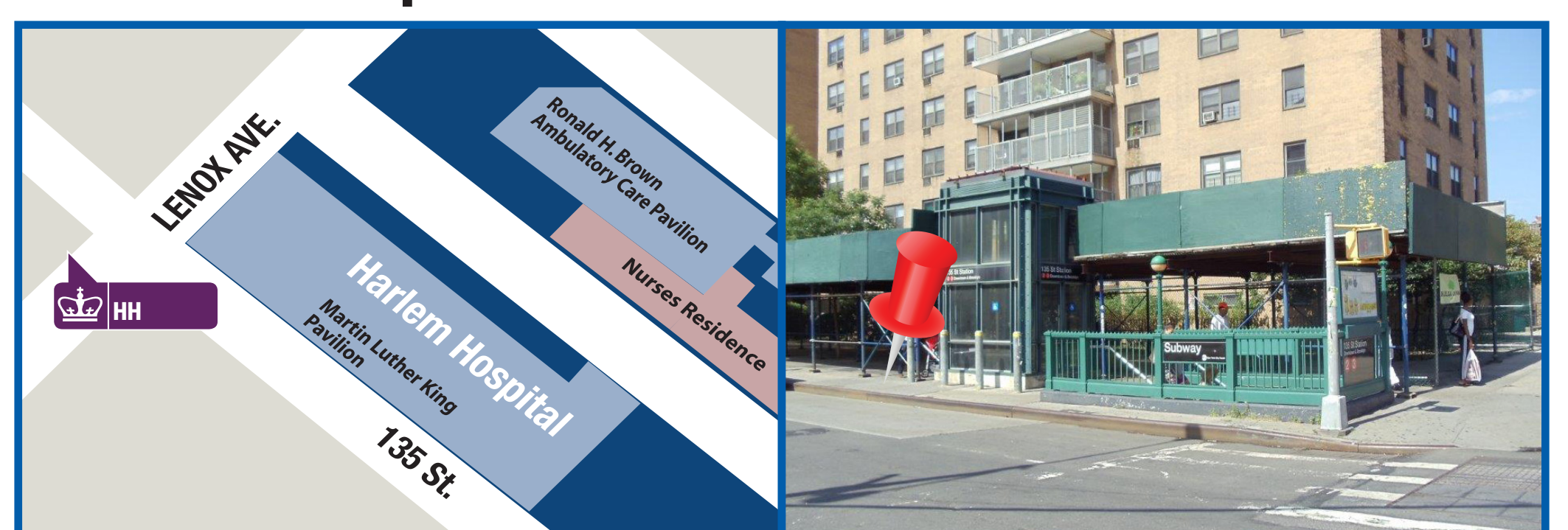

What is the community shuttle?



Columbia University provides free bus shuttle service for the community, M-F, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.

Shuttle service runs year-round, with a more limited schedule in the summer.

Who can use the shuttle?



The shuttle is wheelchair accessible and free for people with disabilities, the elderly and their companions, as well as individuals with service animals.

How do I identify the shuttle?



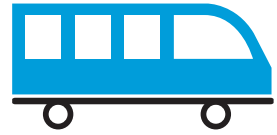
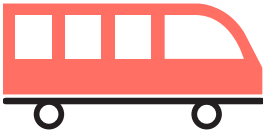
Shuttle service runs via the Columbia Intercampus Shuttle. Look for the **Columbia Community Shuttle** decal next to shuttle doors. This identifies the Intercampus Shuttle for your use.

Where does the shuttle stop?

The shuttle connects 96th Street, the Morningside campus, the Medical Center, and Harlem Hospital with stops at the following locations near subway stations:

Columbia University Medical Center
Harlem Hospital
125th Street & Broadway
116th Street & Broadway
96th Street & Broadway

Red, Green, or Blue?



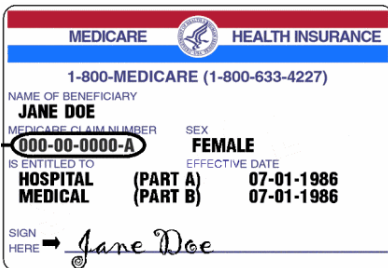
During the Academic year, the route is serviced by three shuttle buses designated as Red, Green, and Blue. You'll see these colors used on the shuttle map on page 6 and the shuttle timetables on pages 9-15.

You can tell which bus is at your stop from the display on the front of the bus. During the summer, the route is serviced by one bus without any color designation.

Do I need an ID to ride the shuttle?

All riders must present a valid ID upon boarding the shuttle. Accepted IDs:

- Medicare Health Insurance Card
- Access-A-Ride ID Card
- MetroCard for Senior Citizens or People with Disabilities

How do I reach frequent destinations?

Columbia University Medical Center

- From 96th Street, look for the **Green shuttle** to reach the CUMC.
- From 116th and 125th Streets, ride the **Red, Blue, or Green shuttles**.

Harlem Hospital

- Service to Harlem Hospital is provided via the **Green shuttle** only.

Where Do I Wait for the Shuttle?

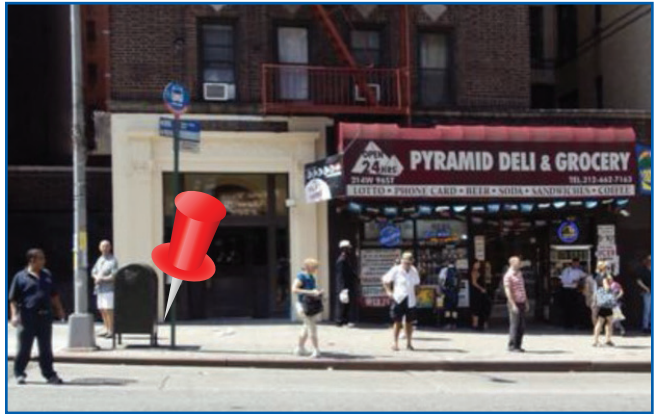
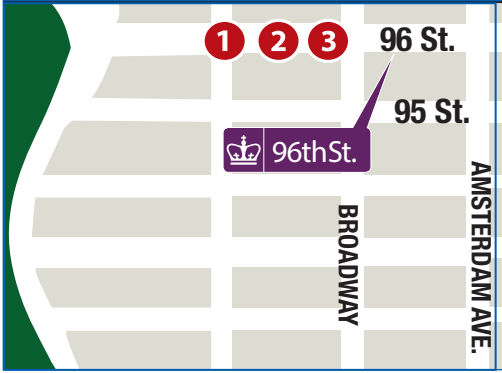

Construction Activities for West Harlem

Construction activities for the West Harlem Campus Plan are scheduled for the weeks of July 11, 2016 and July 18, 2016.

What is happening:

- Installation of advanced fiber optic network infrastructure along Broadway between W125th and W130th streets, and between W130th and W145th streets.
- Installation of ground floor apartment window glazing, exterior wall and temporary support wall.
- Demolition of ground floor brick walls, steel and masonry.
- Demolition of the 4th floor of the existing structure and masonry.
- Removal of masonry along W130th Street.

Landfill Center for the site:

- Final site plan and permit installation.
- Building deck installation work.

Structural Form:

- Installation of formwork, anchor bolts and reinforcement for the foundation walls and columns, and placement of concrete.
- Demolition of existing.
- Installation of upper floor slab formwork, shoring and other steel bracing.
- Formwork installation with waterproofing, insulation and floor deck installation.

Open Space: Small square and site work on W125th, W130th and Broadway around Jerome S. Green Science Center.
