



CONNECTING YOUTH INITIATIVE

Disconnected Youth are a unique population with a unique set of needs to match. By definition, disconnected youth are 16-24 year olds who are neither in school nor working. Many are in grave danger of falling behind in credits, aging out of the school system, and ultimately becoming disconnected. In an effort to support these youth, the Connecting Youth Initiative (CYI), a community and school-based service was formed. CYI grew out of the Outreach to Disconnected Youth commitment required by Columbia University's community benefits and services related to the Manhattanville Campus Expansion. CYI staff are able to reach young people in Northern Manhattan and portions of the Bronx who are in need and connect them to a variety of service providers. CYI participants who work with a case worker receive assistance with getting back on track for high-school completion, referral to a High School Equivalency program, and workforce readiness, to name a few. COMMUNITY SHUTTLE BUS SERVICE

It's cold outside! Columbia University provides a community shuttle bus service free of charge to members of the local community who are disabled or age 65 and older (including their attendants) via the ADA-accessible Intercampus Shuttle. The shuttle bus service connects with subway stations along Broadway at 96th, 116th, 125th, and 168th Street as well as Harlem Hospital on 135th Street and Lenox Ave. The shuttle bus service runs regularly from 9:00am to 5:00pm on weekdays, except on state and federal public holidays. Senior citizens and disabled passengers must show their Access-A-Ride, Reduced-Fare MetroCards, or Medicare cards, in order to access the service.


COLUMBIA COMMUNITY SERVICE

PATHWAYS TO APPRENTICESHIP GRADUATION

On December 4th, 25 individuals took the next step toward their careers in the union construction trades when they graduated from the Pathways to Apprenticeship training program at Columbia University. The program consists of five weeks of intensive skills training and professional development through the organization Pathways to Apprenticeship, Inc. (P2A). P2A provides people from low-income communities with support to access and then succeed in union construction apprenticeship, which are pathways to safe, secure, middle class careers. Since P2A started in 2013, the organization has assisted 268 people from across New York City, 66% of whom are formerly incarcerated, with admission into building trades apprenticeship programs. More than 85% of these graduates are still working in the building trades, and many of them have become P2A Peer Mentors, teaching classes and conducting information sessions. Columbia University is a proud partner of the Upper Manhattan P2A cohort, providing funding and resources to the organization. HOMELESS MEDICAL PARTNERSHIP

The Columbia-Harlem Homeless Medical Partnership (CHHMP) is a walk-in student-run clinic providing free health services. Established in May 2007 by Columbia medical students in partnership with the Center for Family and Community Medicine, the clinic operates every Tuesday evening from 5:30 to 7:30 in the basement of St. Mary's Episcopal Church at 126th Street and Old Broadway. The clinic provides homeless and uninsured individuals in the West Harlem community with basic medical care and health education. To assure continuity, the same group of medical students, residents, and supervising physicians work at the clinic every week.

CHHMP offers physical exams, blood pressure screenings, prescriptions, and referrals to other clinics when necessary, as well as scheduled women's health visits that include cervical cancer screenings. In addition to those primary care services, which are available every Tuesday, CHHMP provides dental care and psychiatry referrals on the 1st Tuesday of every month, occupational therapy on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays, and social work resources every Tuesday. COMMUNITY NALOXONE TRAINING SAVES LIVES

Columbia's School of Nursing began providing naloxone training to students in 2018, and the effort has rapidly expanded to include staff and community members of Upper Manhattan. Sonalee Rau, a student at Mailman School of Public Health, is one of four Columbia students that have been able to administer naloxone, reverse opioid overdoses, and save lives. Recently, she used the naloxone kit to help revive a man who overdosed in East Harlem. Since most opioid deaths are accidental, and there's one approximately every six hours in New York City, providing bystanders with naloxone, an opioid antagonist, and the training to administer it, is vital to public health.

Since January 2018, Columbia has distributed naloxone kits and provided training to more than 2,500 students, faculty, staff, and community members on how to recognize an overdose and provide treatment. Currently, the hour-long trainings are offered monthly and starting this year they will also be offered in public schools in Washington Heights. COLUMBIA-HARLEM SBDC A LIFELINE FOR BUSINESSES

The Columbia-Harlem Small Business Development Center (SBDC) at Columbia Business School has been supporting Harlem businesses throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. Support has primarily taken the form of helping small businesses secure loans and develop plans in order to keep their doors open. This is especially valuable in a community where many business owners are from historically disenfranchised backgrounds.

Due to closures and decreases in revenue, the SBDC has seen a sharp increase in their number of clients, from around 30 clients per advisor to almost 100. They have created guidelines for how to apply for each type of loan, comparisons between funds, and calculators to help business owners understand how much they could be awarded.

"The sense of unknown and the feeling of unfolding doom shifted for us in a way that would not have been possible without the outreach of the Columbia-Harlem SBDC," says Yael Alkalay, CEO and Founder of Red Flower, a spa-products company in Harlem that received loan funding with guidance. "They offered a ray of hope."

COLUMBIA NEIGHBORS FOOD RELIEF FUND

Columbia is stepping up to help food relief efforts in Upper Manhattan by launching the Columbia Neighbors Food Relief Fund. Bringing together the extraordinary resources of the Columbia community, the Food Relief Fund will heighten awareness, raise funds, and deploy resources to address food insecurity.

The COVID-19 pandemic has pushed the pre-existing food insecurity crisis in New York City to an unprecedented level. Nearly two million residents of the city are experiencing food insecurity, representing roughly half of all people in the state struggling with hunger and limited access to food. As food pantries have been pushed to their limits and the city has scrambled to meet rising demand while restricting physical access to limit crowding at distribution points, many local organizations have increased their food support or pivoted their services. Supporting these organizations will help the more than 400,000 New Yorkers who are out of work, many of whom are especially vulnerable to COVID-19.

Every dollar donated to the fund through the Medical Center Neighborhood Fund and the Columbia Community Service Food Relief Project will be used to support the program.

COLUMBIA WEBSITE HELPS FIND COVID-19 TRIALS



Researchers at Columbia University have developed COVID-19 Trial Finder, a website that provides a simplified way for patients, clinicians, and healthy volunteers to search for COVID-related clinical trials. The system also allows potential candidates to screen their eligibility for the trials through a set of short questions, helping them find trials appropriate for them.

Because there are more than 400 COVID-related clinical trials currently underway in the U.S., the process of finding the right trial can be very daunting. The COVID-19 Trial Finder makes the process straightforward and limits information overload.

EMERGENCY LOAN FUND FOR SMALL BUSINESSES

The Columbia Emergency Loan Fund for Small Businesses launched in June. The fund provides low-interest loans to Upper Manhattan small businesses that are struggling because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Loans will help businesses as they restock after interruptions, rehire employees, and reconfigure their operations for this new era of social distancing and health restrictions.

The fund includes two loan programs, each designed to address different business needs caused by the pandemic. The Small-Scale Manufacturer Loans offer up to \$5,000 for businesses with less than \$50,000 in revenue in 2019. The Small Business Pivot Loans offer up to \$50,000 for Upper Manhattan businesses with fewer than 50 employees who need to restructure their business models. Both loans have low interest rates, grace periods for repayment, and partial loan forgiveness opportunities. To receive a loan from the Emergency Loan Fund a business must be a client of the Columbia-Harlem Small Business Development Center.

COLUMBIA NEIGHBORS FOOD RELIEF FUND



The COVID-19 pandemic has pushed the existing NYC food insecurity crisis to unprecedented levels. The Columbia Neighbors Food Relief Fund, supported by donations from the entire University community, has distributed more than \$100,000 to organizations that fight hunger and food insecurity through meals and grocery distribution in Upper Manhattan.

In June, the Food Relief Fund expanded to include a partnership between Columbia Dining, the Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine, and City Harvest that began to distribute 1,000 healthy meals a day on June 15 and will continue until September 7.

NEIGHBORS FOOD RELIEF FUND WORK CONTINUES

Since its establishment this spring, the Columbia Neighbors Food Relief Fund has distributed more than \$100,000 to local organizations fighting hunger in Morningside Heights, Harlem, Washington Heights, and Inwood. The donations collected through the Columbia Community Service (CCS) Food Relief Project and the Medical Center Neighborhood Fund continue to support food pantries, food distribution organizations, and organizations that have expanded their missions to include fighting food insecurity. Some of those organizations include PA'LANTE, CLOTH, Holyrood Church, and more.

Columbia has also developed a partnership with The Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine to distribute meals made by Columbia Dining employees through the Cathedral's social services arm, Cathedral Community Cares. Since June 15, 1,000 meals have been distributed every day, and the program is set to continue through September 7.

COLUMBIA REOPENING UPDATE FOR OUR NEIGHBORS

As Columbia's campus reopens to some undergraduate and graduate students in September, the University has put measures in place to ensure safety for everyone on campus as well as for our surrounding community. With undergraduate classes moving online, the population of students on campus will be dramatically reduced, but all students, faculty, and staff who do return will be required to comply with New York State's mandated 14-day quarantine, as well as completing a daily symptom self-check to enter campus buildings.

No large events or gatherings are planned on campus for the fall. Columbia will continue to comply with New York State regulations on the size of any in-person gatherings. Community members who access College Walk and other outdoor areas of campus are expected to comply with New York State and University guidelines on mask-wearing and physical distancing, which are posted on signs at campus entrances. Columbia will partner with the NYC Test and Trace Corps to ensure that appropriate contact tracing occurs if a community member is potentially exposed.

DEADLINES FOR THE 2020 GENERAL ELECTION

October 9: The final day for in-person voter registration for the November 3 election. By-mail voter registrations also must be postmarked by this day.

October 27: The final day to request an absentee ballot online, by mail, by email, or by fax. Absentee ballots can be submitted by mail, at the Board of Elections, or dropped off at poll sites.

October 24 to November 1 are the dates of Early Voting in New York. Early voting sites may not be the same sites that will be open on Election Day. Hours and site information are available from vote.nyc.gov.



What is Happening

Construction resuming at Columbia Business School site with stringent health and safety measures in place

In accordance with New York State guidance on the updated Executive Order 202.6 - which deems construction supporting public and private schools essential - construction has resumed at Columbia's Manhattanville campus for the Business School and associated below-grade space. Accordingly, the project is included within the New York City Department of Buildings map of Essential Active Construction Sites.

Construction is resuming with a reduced workforce and stringent health and safety measures in place and enforced by the construction manager, Turner Construction, to prioritize the health and safety of construction workers and reduce the spread of COVID-19.

Among the enhanced health and safety measures that Turner has implemented include:

- Temperature scanning and completion of a self-assessment questionnaire completed by all tradespersons and staff when entering the jobsite, conducted by a trained professional with social distancing measures in place. Individuals with a high temperature reading will not be allowed to enter the site and will follow a strict protocol as to when they can return.
- A schedule of staggered start and end times for subcontractor shifts to reduce crowding when waiting to enter and leave the site, as well as staggering break times and lunch times for increased social distancing.
- Methods to facilitate maintaining six-foot distancing between workers, including defined directions on where to queue the line when entering the site; limit to the number of individuals on the hoist at any one time to maintain a minimum of six feet between individuals; and designated up and down staircases.
- Turner has developed a COVID-19 Personal Protective Equipment standard, providing means and methods designed to be consistent with current CDC Guidance. This COVID-19 PPE standard includes the requirement that all tradespersons, staff, and site visitors wear a mask or face covering in addition to standard personal protective equipment, among other procedures and requirements.

The health and safety of staff and tradespeople and implementing measures that will continue to reduce the spread of infection were essential for Columbia and Turner before allowing any construction activities to resume.
