Mind Brain Behavior Public Outreach Center. CU shall locate within Development Site 2 (the proposed Jerome L. Greene Science Center) a Screening and Education Center for community outreach. The purpose of the Center shall be to provide stroke awareness lectures and free blood pressure and cholesterol screenings. The Center shall commence operation upon issuance of the temporary certificate of occupancy for the Jerome L. Greene Science Center and operate for a 25-year period from commencement of full operation.

*The center opened to the public in September 2017. Therefore, this obligation will be in effect until 2042, 25 years from the commencement of the center's full operation.

Alternatives Based on Innovation

Columbia University's Wellness Center opened in the Jerome L. Greene Science Center in 2017 and has since provided health education, community resources and free health screenings to the West Harlem community, as well as trained members of the Harlem community to become advocates to prevent stroke and mental health through the Institute for Training Outreach and Community Health (InTOuCH) and Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) programs. The success of this training led to the expansion of the Center's focus to building capacity in the community, by training individuals from faith and community-based organizations (CBO) to be certified community health workers.

In 2023, upgrades were made to the Wellness Center model to focus on Community Health Worker (CHW) training and the center was renamed to "Columbia Center for Community Health". Under the center's supervision, these CHWs continue to provide stroke awareness lectures, free blood pressure, and cholesterol screenings, but with the evidence driven framework of meeting people where they are. Screenings are largely performed off-site, at local faith and community-based organizations or at community-focused health events. The Center continues to operate in the Jerome L. Greene Science Center as a screening and education center focused on stroke awareness and free blood pressure and cholesterol screenings.

Located in Columbia University's new Jerome L. Greene Science Center in West Harlem

The Wellness Center provides free blood pressure readings, cholesterol screening and AIC glucose testing to the community. Visitors will receive a record of their results, as well as information on ways they can improve their health.

On request, Wellness Center staff will provide information about free and low-cost health care available throughout Harlem and upper Manhattan. The Wellness Center will also provide onsite assistance with health insurance enrollment.

In addition to providing free blood pressure and cholesterol screening, the Wellness Center is home to two programs dedicated to empowering the community through health education.

The Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) program is dedicated to improving access to quality mental health in Harlem. The program teaches participants the warning signs of mental health problems, helps build an understanding of the importance of early intervention and seeking support. Information about support groups, tools for mental health, and local resources will be provided.

The Institute for Training Outreach and Community Health (InTOuCH) is a free community-based program designed to raise awareness about stroke and heart attack prevention. Through its rigorous training program, InTOuCH participants commit to serving the community as volunteer health workers and as counselors at Columbia's Wellness Center and local screening events.

Stroke Awareness

The Columbia Center for Community Health houses the Community Health Worker Stroke Prevention program, which empowers communities to combat stroke. The program includes 6-week trainings, held throughout the year that provide local residents with the tools they need to become community health workers. Volunteers learn about various

cardiovascular health topics, including motivational interviewing, with a special emphasis on stroke and related risk factors. Alumni of the program serve as health advocates in their communities and at faith-based organizations, with the overall goal of improving stroke outcomes and lowering the prevalence of stroke and related risk factors. The curriculum was developed with the assistance of community focus groups and in consultation with experts in health education.

The program, modeled on the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's CHW training curriculum, with the addition of culturally tailored multimedia components, is led by Olajide Williams, MD, chief of staff of neurology and associate professor of neurology at Columbia University Medical Center, founder of Hip Hop Public Health, and codirector of the Center for Stroke Disparities Solutions in New York.

COLUMBIA CENTER FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH

Columbia University's Wellness Center opened in the Jerome L. Green Science Center (JLG) in 2016 and has since provided health education, community resources and free health screenings to the West Harlem community, as well as trained members of the Harlem community to become advocates to prevent stroke and mental health through the Institute for Training Outreach and Community Health (InTOuCH) and Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) programs. The success of this training led to the expansion of the Center's work to include building capacity in the community, by training individuals from faith and community-based organizations (CBO) to be certified community health workers (CHWs). In 2023, the Center was renamed as "Columbia Center for Community Health" (CCCH) to reflect the increased scope of providing more CHW training and to increase its community impact.

This new name will help us move our mission forward, allowing us to continue to meet our objectives by providing the community with preventative measures related to stroke and cardiovascular disease, mental health screening and outreach services. We will continue to engage and broaden our community partnerships guided by a Public Health Critical Race Praxis framework for promoting health. The Columbia Center for Community Health will continue to expand community health programming by deepening relationships with local faith and community-based organizations, to include other marginalized groups such as formerly incarcerated residents who have shown leadership and excellence in community advocacy.



ORGANIZATION OF COLUMBIA CENTER FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH

The Columbia Center for Community Health operates under five arms: Training, Outreach, Research, Screening, and Workforce Development.



Training

The training arm, known as the Institute for Training Outreach and Community Health (InTOuCH) program is dedicated to training lay and professional volunteers from faith and community-based organizations to become certified community health workers. The eight- week training program offers a comprehensive curriculum covering a range of health topics on stroke and cardiovascular disease prevention, including stroke, heart attack, diabetes, high blood pressure, cholesterol levels, motivational interviewing, navigating the NYS health insurance exchange, healthy nutrition and physical activity.

Outreach

Through the InTOuCH training, CHWs become proficient in manual blood pressure measurement techniques, A1C testing, and acquire effective communication skills for stroke and cardiovascular disease health counseling among other skills. Alumni CHWs conduct free community health screenings, provide referrals for medical follow-up, and lead community research projects.

Research

Alumni community health workers receive continued health education (CHE) and specialty-specific trainings to lead community research studies. Our CHWs are currently leading three NIH funded studies: (i) TRIUMPH study (Transforming your Mental Health through Prayer and Healing) which aims to work with Black churches in New York City to identify community members experiencing stress, anxiety, grief from loss, or depression (ii) CHURCH trial (Community Health Workers United to Reduce Colorectal and Cardiovascular Disease among People at Higher Risk) that collaborates with Black churches in New York City to identify community members at risk for colorectal cancer (CRC) and connect them with screening options, and (iii) SIGHT study that conducts vision screening for community members residing at the New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) buildings.

Screening

Our certified CHWs provide health screenings for blood pressure, cholesterol, glucose, body mass index (BMI), HbA1C, mental health, and colorectal cancer at community health fairs, health screenings, faith-based organizations, and community-based organizations.

Workforce Development

Building on the success of the InTOuCH program, we are currently working on expanding and upgrading our existing CHW training curriculum with a major focus on racial and socioeconomic determinants of health. With a standardized CHW curriculum, for the first time we would be able to establish a system of training and certification—thus providing CHWs with a formal scope of practice. The standardized curriculum would be a step toward allowing federal and private insurance agencies to consider reimbursing CHWs directly for their work at competitive wages so that their pay reflects their valuable contributions to community public health.

GLOBAL COLLABORATION



The Columbia Center for Community Health in collaboration with the Columbia Global Center, Mumbai hosted a learning collaborative "Training Community Health Workers After COVID-19" in Mumbai, India. The goal of this learning collaborative was to: (1) present lessons from InTOuCH's program in New York City (2) learn from successes and challenges from CHWs in India and (3) explore potential for partnerships. The workshop was attended by dignitaries from the Indian government, civil society and international aid organizations with an experience in developing, implementing and monitoring community-based programs with Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs). We hope to build on this exploratory collaboration to develop a more robust training and evaluation practices based on global models.

NATIONAL ACTION NETWORK TO HOST COMMUNITY FORUM ON ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE/DEMENTIA AND HEALTHY BRAIN AGING IN HARLEM ON MAY 6", 2023

New York, NY - Harlem residents are invited to take part in a Community Forum on Alzheimer's disease and other dementias sponsored by NYU Langone and Columbia University at Rev. Al Sharpton's National Action Network's headquarters, the House of Justice, 106 West 145* Street, New York, NY on Saturday, May 6, 2023, at 12 noon – 2 p.m.

Columbia University will also provide free blood pressure screenings as well as resources about how hypertension can be prevented and managed.

Today, New York City alone has an estimated 410,000 Alzheimer's disease victims, with Harlem being home to a disproportionate number of them. The forum provides an opportunity for residents of all ages to come together to ask questions about the disease, share their personal experiences, learn about available resources, and discover paid volunteer opportunities to participate in research on how race and sleep impact an individual's risk for developing Alzheimer's Disease.

The featured speaker is the Alzheimer's Disease specialist Dr. Omonigho M.
