Graduate Scholarships for Elementary School Teachers. In an effort to enhance the quality of elementary school education within the local community, and as part of Columbia University's strong commitment to supporting quality education for the community, commencing with the acquisition by ESD or CU of all Initial Stage 1 Condemnation Parcels, and continuing for a 25-year period from commencement, CU shall establish three scholarships for qualified teachers to earn a master's degree in an appropriate field from Columbia University or Teacher's College. The three scholarships shall be awarded to qualified elementary school teachers either currently teaching within Community District 9 or interested in teaching elementary school within Community District 9. A maximum of three scholarships shall be in force at any given time with a cumulative maximum of 18 credits per year. Recipients of the scholarships: a) must be admitted to the masters program of choice; b) agree to teach within Community District 9 for five years after they commence their participation in the scholarship program; and c) meet related criteria of the NYCDOE, the United Federation of Teachers, and/or the local school principal.

*The first graduate scholarship recipient enrolled in classes in 2013, one year after the trigger date. Therefore, this obligation will be in effect until 2038, 25 years from the commencement of the obligation implementation.

The cumulative maximum of 18 credits per academic year makes it likely that only one student will be awarded a scholarship annually due to the master’s degree program credit requirements. The recruitment and selection processes continue to be modified going forward. It is anticipated that depending on the program selected by the scholarship recipient and requirements of the specific program selected, there could be a need to adjust the recruitment process annually to meet the need.

*Recipient #1 accelerated her matriculation and was able to utilize 36 (two years’ worth) credits in a little less than 18 months. As a result, no new scholarship was awarded in school year 2014-2015.

**Recipient #2 was awarded 18 credits for use in Academic Year 2015-2016. She utilized 10 of these credits and then chose to use other credits she received from having a student teacher in her classroom to cover the remainder of her courses.

Note: Recipient #7 was awarded 12 credits but utilized financial aid in lieu of the scholarship because she was unsure if she could maintain the commitment to teach within CD9 for 5 years.

Teachers College Grants & Other Awards

Dean's Grant for Student Research

You may qualify for this grant if you are enrolled in a Teachers College Master's or Doctoral program. If you are selected, you will receive up to \$2,000 for a project that advances education and scholarly inquiry at Teachers College. This is a competitive grant program, with between five and eight grants awarded each year.

Doctoral Dissertation Grant

If you are a current Doctoral student who has defended or will defend your dissertation, then you may be eligible for this grant. The grant provides \$6,250 to Ed.D. students to recognize and support outstanding doctoral work, recipients are selected based on merit. Ph.D. students may qualify for an extra \$1,500 award, given to help cover the tuition charged for the semester when you defend your dissertation.

Eligibility Criteria

- Current doctoral student enrollment, registered for semester applied, and in good academic standing.
- Fully certified and approved dissertation proposal with IRB approval on file with the Office of Doctoral Studies.
- Has defended or is on track to defend a dissertation during the semester applied.

How to Apply

You may apply by submitting a DDG Interest Form, available each Fall and Spring semester,

to the Office of Financial Aid. In addition, you must include:

- A written statement that describes:
 - The focus of your dissertation inquiry, including a statement of rationale, research questions, and methods for collection and analyses of data.
 - The status of your dissertation project to date.
 - The timeline for completion of your dissertation, including the oral defense
- A one-page letter of recommendation from your Teachers College faculty dissertation sponsor that addresses:
 - The importance of the question being asked in your dissertation
 - An affirmation that your proposed dissertation timeline is feasible and realistic

 - Proposed Date of Dissertation Defense.
